## ANALYSIS & ACTION PLAN

### Pupil Wellbeing Survey – Autumn Term 2025 Summary

We asked our pupils what they like most about school, and their responses show just how much they value being part of our school community.

Children told us they enjoy:

- **Learning and lessons** – Pupils said they like the wide range of subjects, especially art, computing, PE, maths and science, and how teachers make learning fun and engaging.
- **Supportive teachers** – Many pupils said they feel cared for and helped when they find things difficult, and that teachers make sure they understand their learning.
- **Friendships and kindness** – Pupils said they enjoy spending time with friends, playing games at breaktime, and that people in school are kind, respectful and supportive.
- **Clubs, sport and trips** – Children spoke positively about sports, after-school clubs, and school trips that help them learn beyond the classroom.
- **Feeling respected and safe** – Pupils said they feel listened to, that their ideas are valued, and that they can express themselves without worrying about making mistakes.

Overall, the feedback shows that our pupils are **happy, confident and enjoy learning in a caring and supportive environment.**

We always listen carefully to what our pupils tell us about their school experience. This term, pupils shared lots of great ideas through our survey. Below is a summary of the main themes and how our school plans to respond.

### ***Pupil Voice: “One thing that would make school even better would be...”***

| <b>More playground equipment and activities</b> | Pupils asked for more things to do at break, such as trampolines, slides, ziplines, and gymnastics spaces. | We will review our playground provision with the School Council and plan new equipment or resources for active play. We'll also set up a pupil-led “Playtime Ideas” board to collect suggestions termly.   |
| <b>More clubs and sports opportunities</b>      | Many pupils requested extra clubs, including dodgeball, baseball, football, gymnastics, and swimming.      | We will expand our club offer where possible, adding new options each term. Pupil feedback will help decide which clubs to prioritise. We'll also continue to enter more inter-school sports competitions. |

| Theme  | What pupils said   | School response / action   |

| <b>More learning time and help with subjects</b> | Some pupils said they'd like more Maths, Science, and extra help with tricky topics (like Roman numerals). | We will continue to provide extra challenge and support through small group work and interventions. Teachers will look for ways to make lessons even more active and engaging.             |
| <b>Kindness and positive attitudes</b>           | A few pupils wanted everyone to be kinder and follow our school values more closely.                       | We will continue to promote our <b>SMART values</b> and positive behaviour through assemblies, PSHE, and class discussions. The School Council will lead a "Kindness Challenge" this term. |
| <b>Lunches and breaktimes</b>                    | A few pupils mentioned healthier lunches and wanting to eat packed lunches.                                | We'll share this feedback with our kitchen team and review our lunch menu with pupil input at the next School Council meeting.   |
| <b>Trips and special days</b>                    | Pupils said they enjoy school trips, non-uniform days, and fun lessons.                                    | We'll continue to plan a range of enrichment activities, themed days, and trips that bring learning to life.   |
